Justice Coalition's 3rd Annual Victory Over Violence Breakfast

135-Year Prison Sentence for Predator in Child Sexual Abuse Material, Animal Sex Conduct Case

Attorney General James Uthmeier announced that David Robert McKeown of Volusia County was sentenced to 135 years in the Florida Department of Corrections for possession of child pornography and sexual conduct with an animal. "The abuse and trauma this predator inflicted is sick, and he deserves every moment of this sentence," said Attorney General James Uthmeier. "We will always seek the longest sentence possible for anyone who harms innocent children or defenseless animals.

Thanks to Senior Assistant Statewide Prosecutor Emily Frazier and the Holly Hill Police Department, this criminal has been brought to justice and will not be allowed to harm another child or animal again."

Holly Hill Police Department launched the investigation following a cyber tip from online social platform Discord. The investigation revealed that McKeown was a teacher at UBIC Academy and utilized school Wi-Fi to send and receive child sexual abuse materials during school hours. Additionally, investigators discovered videos of McKeown sexually abusing the family pet. McKeown was subsequently arrested.

McKeown was charged with one count of aggravated possession of child pornography, 18 counts of possession of child pornography, and six counts of sexual conduct with an animal by the Office of Statewide Prosecution.

During sentencing, Circuit Judge A. Christian Miller designated McKeown as a sexual offender and ensured he will not be allowed to own any animals once his 135-year prison sentence is complete.

On the morning of November 14th, the room at Evangel Temple Lodge was filled with anticipation, hope, and compassion as we gathered for the 3rd Annual Victory Over Violence Breakfast. This event honored innocent victims of violent crime and their families across the North Florida area.

In attendance were our founder's wife and son, Ms. Wanda and Wesley Hires, along with community leaders, victims, sponsors, and law enforcement representatives from Clay, Duval, Nassau, and St. Johns counties. Also present were members of the Mayor's office, the State Attorney's and Public Defender's offices, several judges, Jacksonville City Council members, and past representatives and dignitaries.

The breakfast, prepared by the cooks from the Fraternal Order of Police, was excellent. The speakers were inspiring, each sharing their involvement with the Justice Coalition, their history of serving victims, or personal experiences of how crime forever changed their lives.

Guest speakers included emcee Vic Micolucci; Pastor Amos Bankhead, a longtime volunteer who offered opening remarks; Clerk of the Court Jody Phillips; Congressman John Rutherford; Mrs. Rose Devoe of the Gabriel Devoe Foundation; Forrest Bailey of the Tristyn Bailey Foundation; Robert Bracewell, Justice Coalition Executive Director, who shared a video message from John Walsh; Mrs. Connie Pittman, the first victim assisted by Ted Hires after founding the organization; Sheriff Robert Hardwick of St. Johns County, who spoke on violence reduction; and Foster Coker, a home invasion survivor and Justice Coalition board member, who delivered closing comments.

Highlights of the event included recognition of victims and families, historical displays of the Justice Coalition, a flower presentation, and the powerful stories of survivors. Emotions ran high—tears were shed, love was shared, and healing began. All present were blessed by our Creator.

We extend heartfelt thanks to everyone who contributed to the success of this year's breakfast. The fact that no food was left over is a testament to the event's impact. Special thanks go to Mrs. Rose Devoe for her beautiful decorations; Ms. Betty Hayes and the ladies of the Lakeshore Women's Club for their professional handling of registration; Mrs. Kelly Chatham for curating the Justice Coalition's historical displays; our dedicated board members, sponsors, speakers, and volunteers for their invaluable support; and Pastor Jordan Wiggins, Evangel Temple staff, Tabatha, and Paige for providing the venue.

As we close this recap of the 3rd Annual Victory Over Violence Breakfast, let us carry forward these thoughts: be kind always, help others whenever you can, and get involved to make a difference for those who need it most. As our founder Ted Hires believed, one person can make a difference. Be that person.

Remembering Lonzie Barton



Friday, July 24, 2015, is a day still very clear in my mind. I woke that morning, flipped on the morning show on Channel 4 News, and began preparing myself for the workday ahead. At the time, I had just completed my second full year as a Channel 4 general assignment news reporter, and was looking forward to my soon-to-be new role in life: mother. I was about 4 months pregnant with my first child, a boy. Splashed across the television screen was the image of a blonde-haired, blue-eyed little boy posing in oversized cowboy boots, which only accentuated his small toddler frame. The headline was even more shocking: the little boy, 21-month-old Lonzie Barton, was missing. The man who called police was Ruben Ebron, the boyfriend of Lonzie's mother, Lonna Barton. Ebron told police his car had been stolen from outside an apartment building with the toddler inside. The car was discovered a short time later, but there was no sign of Lonzie.

What ensued in the hours and days following Lonzie's disappearance were around the clock police briefings, updates, and searches. Lonzie's disappearance galvanized the community. It seemed everyone in Northeast Florida was talking about the little boy. Community members in Jacksonville and Baker County were holding prayer vigils, tips were coming in, and then-Jacksonville Sheriff's Office Director Tom Hackney was becoming a local household name. Every day, viewers tuned in to hear his informative, yet tenderhearted updates on the search for Lonzie. Years later, I still find myself recalling how Hackney sounded more like a loving father than a policeman.

As the community searched for a missing child, behind the scenes, things were unraveling. Ebron's story was falling apart, and Lonna Barton was under intense public scrutiny. The police said when it came to her son's whereabouts or what happened to him, she was lying. The police were frustrated, the community wanted answers, and finally, she was arrested. Barton was arrested for child neglect and giving false information to law enforcement. Within weeks of her release from the Duval County Jail, Barton was arrested again. She and her husband, Chris Barton (Lonzie's father), were arrested in Baker County for drug-related charges. That night, I remember receiving a phone call from a source in Baker County, telling me I needed to get to Macclenny. An hour later, I and other local reporters held microphones as we walked, firing off questions at the Bartons as deputies led them to the jail. I vividly recall one question being asked: "Lonna, do you even love Lonzie?"

Fast forward to January 2016, Ebron finally broke. As part of a plea agreement, he led investigators to Lonzie's remains buried beneath a pile of tires in a wooded area off State Road 9B. The final account shared with the public was that Lonzie drowned in a bathtub as Lonna Barton and Ruben Ebron were having sex. To this day, I do not believe that's what happened. Both pleaded guilty to charges and received prison sentences.

In late November 2025, Lonna Barton was released and is settling into her new life outside of Florida. Ebron remains behind bars.

All these years later, it is hard to believe so much has happened. The little boy I was carrying at the time is now about to turn 10 years old. If Lonzie were alive today, he would be 12. He'd be in school, playing with his siblings, making new friends, and enjoying the carefree days of childhood. Though we will likely never know the full truth about what happened to Lonzie, it is my sincere hope and prayer his memory is never forgotten.

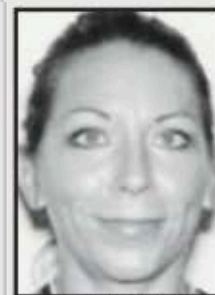

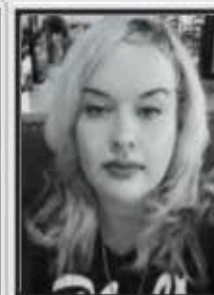

On Sunday, March 17th, 2024, St. Patrick's Day, in Jacksonville Beach, police said the incidents started Sunday with a planned gathering of 250-400 people in their late teens and early 20s under the pier. Jacksonville Beach Police Chief Gene Paul Smith said officers broke up the crowd because they started fighting. The first shooting happened as the crowd separated. They said 21-year-old James Jones III was rushed to the hospital after he was shot around 8:30 p.m. Sunday in the parking lot of a sports restaurant on Beach Boulevard at 1st Street North. Operation Home for the Holidays Rescues 122 Children



In November, during "Operation: Home for the Holidays," led by the U.S. Marshals, the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office in coordination with the Northeast Florida INTERCEPT Task Force, local, state and federal law enforcement partners located 22 missing children in Northeast Florida.

JSO's cameras were rolling when detectives found two teenage girls who had been missing for weeks. These two juveniles are now able to get the support they need.

In addition to these operations, JSO has dedicated Missing Persons Unit detectives who work year-round locating children. It doesn't matter if they've been missing for an hour or a year, they won't stop until they find them.

Citizens are reminded that harboring runaways is a crime. Anyone that knows the location of a child who may be reported missing is asked to please call police or the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children at 1.800.THE.LOST.
