AG James Uthmeier Launches Lawsuit Against TikTok

Deceiving Parents about the Safety of its Platform; Failure to Comply with HB3



“TikTok’s success hinges on its ability to addict children and teenagers to the platform.”

“TikTok knowingly deceives parents and allows children to be exposed to harmful and inappropriate content in direct violation of Florida law. We have zero tolerance for companies that prioritize profit over children’s safety. TikTok should expect to be held accountable.”

According to a June 15, 2026 article from Florida's Office of the Attorney General, Attorney General James Uthmeier sued TikTok, alleging the popular social media platform committed a series of violations of Florida law by actively targeting and contracting with minors while deceiving parents about the dangers of the app.

“The State of Florida stands with families in protecting our children from the abuses of addictive social media apps,” said Representative Chip LaMarca. “Thank you to the AG for pursuing the fight against these bad actors.” The complaint alleges that TikTok is in violation of House Bill 3, Florida’s online child protections law, which took effect on January 1, 2025. Specifically, TikTok is accused of letting children less than 14 years old create accounts, and letting 15- and 16-year-olds do the same without parental consent. Both violate H.B. 3, which bans children less than 14 years of age from social media platforms entirely and requires parental consent for 15 and 16-year-olds to create accounts.

The lawsuit also alleges that TikTok is violating the Florida Deceptive and Unfair Trade Practices Act by deceiving parents about the safety and appropriateness of the content their children will have access to. TikTok advertises itself on the app store as being appropriate for children 13 years and older, and characterizes mature themes including sex content, drug content, profanity, self-harm/suicide, and eating disorders as “mild” and “infrequent” – a claim that is blatantly false. These themes are present very frequently on the app, and are often shown/discussed in graphic detail.

Beyond TikTok’s failures to protect children, it also deliberately targets children as its intended users. TikTok’s business model is built to prey upon addictive behaviors, which children and teenagers are particularly vulnerable to experiencing. Attorney General Uthmeier further alleges that TikTok has internally been aware of the dangers to children for years and has knowingly ignored them.

DEADLY Shootings

Over July 4 Weekend - Reported Mass Shootings on the Rise

A violent Fourth of July weekend left two people dead and two others wounded in four separate shootings across Jacksonville, police said. Coupled with a significant number of reported mass shootings since the start of 2026, Jacksonville is making headlines in a way that has many concerned about the trend of more mass shootings than any other area in Florida.

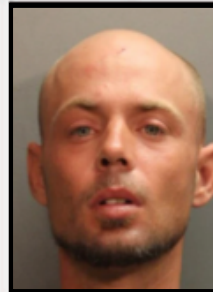
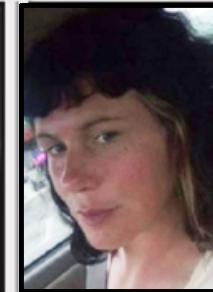
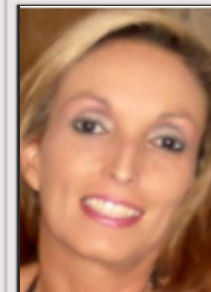
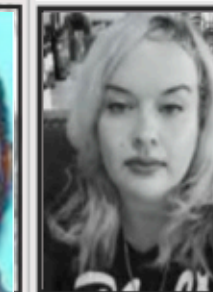

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The Long Road Back: Teens,
Marijuana, and Driving in North Florida

In North Florida, a single decision to get behind the wheel can ripple through a community for years. For teens, combining marijuana use with driving isn’t just risky, it’s deadly.

Cannabis impairment slows reaction times, distorts time and distance perception, and dulls vigilance needed to monitor traffic, pedestrians, and road signs.

Florida law treats marijuana impairment seriously: a driver with a significant blood THC level can face DUI charges, along with vehicular homicide, and many other charges with consequences that reach far beyond a night in trouble.

Teens, whose brains are still developing, often underestimate risk or overestimate their driving abilities after using marijuana. Peer pressure, inexperience, and the desire to fit in create a dangerous mix.

A recent, cautious reminder

Sidney Reshawn Harrell’s March 2026 case, among others in our region, underscores how quickly routine driving can become catastrophic when impairment is involved. While details continue to emerge, the core message is unwavering: impaired driving carries consequences that extend to victims, families, and communities. Law enforcement, schools, and community groups need to respond with stronger education and prevention efforts, aiming to reduce future harm and support those affected.

The human costs

- Families are torn with the loss of loved ones, victims and survivors bear physical injuries, emotional trauma, and long journeys to recovery.
 - Even when there isn’t a fatality, survivors carry scars—visible and invisible—that persist for years.
 - Families face medical bills, transportation needs, and the emotional toll of uncertainty.
 - Communities lose potential: a teen’s education, athletic seasons, and opportunities can be disrupted or cut short.
- What the data and experience teach
- Impairment isn’t about “how high you feel.” It’s about whether you can react quickly to changing traffic, pedestrians, or road conditions.
 - A teen driver may feel calm after using cannabis, but their ability to judge speeds, distances, and braking timing is compromised.
 - Florida’s DUI framework reflects the reality that cannabis impairment is a safety issue, with penalties that can include license suspension, fines, and criminal charges, in addition to long-term personal and social consequences.

Practical guidance for teens, parents, and schools

- Parents, Teachers, Adults, Have honest conversations about marijuana and driving. Emphasize that impairment affects reaction time, attention, and decision-making, not just “feeling high.”
- Plan safe alternatives: designate a sober driver, call for a rideshare, or postpone driving until completely sober and alert.
- Know the law and consequences. Familiarize yourself with Florida’s DUI penalties, especially for teen drivers, including possible license impacts and legal ramifications.
- Seek support if needed. If you or someone you know is struggling with substance use, contact a trusted adult, school counselor, or local treatment resources. Victims and families can access guidance on navigating legal processes and healing resources.

A community-centered approach

- Prevention through education: provide clear, factual information about impairment and driving safety for teens, parents, and educators.
- Victim-centered support: ensure resources for survivors and families, including counseling, legal guidance, and help navigating court processes.
- Accountability with pathways to rehabilitation: acknowledge harms, promote responsibility, and offer constructive avenues for action and recovery.

Call to action for readers

- Start important conversations about safe decisions after cannabis use. Encourage peers to choose safer transportation options.
- If you’ve witnessed or been affected by an impaired-driving incident, reach out to the Victim’s Advocate for confidential support and resources, including information about protective steps and healing services.
- Schools and youth organizations: consider implementing evidence-based prevention programs that address marijuana impairment and driving, plus peer-led discussions and access to safe transportation after events.

Closing note

Healing and safer streets begin with honest conversations, informed choices, and a community that refuses to normalize impaired driving. By sharing these stories, we honor those affected and empower teens to choose a safer path for themselves and their friends.
